

## 2010 - 2011 Course Registration Information Sheet

### 1. New Courses:

- Honors Shakespeare Grade 12
- Public Speaking Grades 11, 12

### 2. Changes:

- AP English Language & Composition Grade 11
- AP United States History Grade 11
  - Students are not required to take AP English Language and Composition in conjunction with AP U.S. History (page 22 of the CHS Program of Studies).
- All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam

### 3. World Language:

The Board of Education (BOE) is studying the possibility of offering academic and honors courses for Level II, Level III, and Level IV world language classes; all Level V classes are honors or AP and will remain so. If you are considering taking a world language class, but are hesitant to do so because of the lack of academic or honors levels, tell us what your preference would be by putting an H (for Honors) or an A (for Academic) next to the course of your choice. Once the BOE makes a final decision, you can decide whether or not you want to remain enrolled in a world language class should the BOE decide not to add academic and honors classes.

### 4. VHS Courses:

- Obtain application from Ms. Cook, Room 215, or the Guidance office.

### 5. College Now/Partnership Programs:
