

**CANTON MIDDLE SCHOOL
SUGGESTED SUPPLY LIST
FOR GRADES 7 & 8**



- A separate, single-subject notebook for each class.
(Note: English class suggests a marble bound notebook; all other classes suggest a spiral bound notebook with a built in folder.)
- A separate folder for each academic class.
- Pencil case/box with: blue/black pens, pencils, eraser, "post-it" notes, highlighter, glue stick, couple of colored pencils, white out, ruler.
- 1 1/2" thick binder for math class (to protect the single unit, paperbound math books and avoid replacement fines.)
- TI-34 Multiview calculator (NOT required but suggested if buying your child a calculator.)
- If you are purchasing a backpack, remember that the lockers are 11" deep X 12 inches wide.

DRESS FOR SUCCESS



Any attire that interferes with the learning process or could be injurious to the health and safety of any student will not be allowed. Student dress should be modest and in good taste for an educational setting. It is the responsibility of each student to understand the dress code. While the following is not an all-inclusive listing, specific items that are not permitted for wear include:

- clothing with alcohol, tobacco or other drug messages
- clothing having indecent writing, indecent pictures or indecent slogans
- clothing that promotes intolerance or disrespect of individuals or groups of individuals
- clothing which exposes bare back and midriffs
- halter tops
- tank tops with single or spaghetti straps
- clothing which exposes undergarments
- extremely "short" shorts*
- strapless clothing
- clothing which overexposes the chest and/or thigh areas

*Shorts or skirts, at a minimum, should come to the student's fingertips when his/her hands are at his/her sides. The same "fingertip" rule holds for students who choose to wear "leggings". The top worn over the leggings must come to the student's fingertips.

Coats, hats and bandanas are not to be worn to class. Shoes (foot wear) must be worn at all times. Clothing should be neat and clean.

The school administration or assigned designee has the authority to deal immediately with any violators of the dress code. Students dressed inappropriately will be asked to arrange for a clothing change. With repeat offenders, parents will be notified and disciplinary consequences may be levied.
